

DECEIT

H4820 - mirmâh - From H7411 in the sense of *deceiving*; *fraud*: - craft, deceit (-ful, -fully), false, feigned, guile, subtilly, treachery.
deceit, treachery

H7411 - râmah - A primitive root; to *hurl*; specifically to *shoot*; figuratively to *delude* or *betray* (as if causing to fall): - beguile, betray, [bow-] man, carry, deceive, throw.
to cast, shoot, hurl; (Qal) to throw; bow-shooters, bowmen (participle); (Piel) to throw down; to beguile, deceive, mislead, deal treacherously; (Piel) to beguile, deceive, mislead, trick; to deal treacherously with, betray

H7423 - r^emi^hyâh - From H7411; *remissness*, *treachery*: - deceit (-ful, -fully), false, guile, idle, slack, slothful.
laxness, slackness, slackening, deceit, treachery

H8496 - tôk tôk - (The second form used in Psa_72:14); from the same base as H8432 (in the sense of *cutting* to pieces); *oppression*: - deceit, fraud.
injury, oppression, oppressor; (TWOT) fraud, deceit, deceitful

H8432 - tâvek - From an unused root meaning to *sever*; a *bisection*, that is, (by implication) the *centre*: - among (-st), X between, half, X (there-, where-) in (-to), middle, mid [-night], midst (among), X out (of), X through, X with (-in).

H8649 - tormâh tarmûth tarmi^hyth - From H7411; *fraud*: - deceit (-ful), privily.
treachery, fraud, deceit, deceitfulness

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to cast, shoot, hurl; (Qal)to throw; bow-shooters, bowmen (participle); (Piel) to throw down, to beguile, deceive, mislead, deal treacherously; (Piel) to beguile, deceive, mislead, trick; to deal treacherously with, betray

H4860 - mashshâ'ôn - From H5377; *dissimulation*: - deceit.
guile, dissimulation, deceit

H5377 - nâshâ' - A primitive root; to *lead astray*, that is, (mentally) to *delude*, or (morally) to *seduce*: - beguile, deceive, X greatly, X utterly.
to beguile, deceive; (Niphal) to be beguiled; (Hiphil) to beguile, deceive; (Qal) utterly (infinitif)

G1388 - dolos - From dellō (an obsolete primary probably meaning to *decoy*; compare G1185); a *trick (bait)*, that is, (figuratively) *wile*: - craft, deceit, guile, subtility. craft, deceit, guile

G1185 - deleazō - From the baes of G1388; to *entrap*, that is, (figuratively) *delude*: - allure, beguile, entice. to bait, catch by a bait; metaph. to beguile by blishments, allure, entice, deceive

G1387 - dolioō - From G1386; to *be guileful*: - use deceit. to deceive, use deceit

G1386 - dolios - From G1388; *guileful*: - deceitful. deceitful

G539 - apatē - From G538; *delusion*: - deceit (-ful, -fulness), deceivableness (-ving). deceit, deceitfulness

G538 - apataō - Of uncertain derivation; to *cheat*, that is, *delude*: - deceive. to cheat, beguile, deceive

G4106 - planē - Feminine of G4108 (as abstraction); objectively *fraudulence*; subjectively a *straying* from orthodoxy or piety: - deceit, to deceive, delusion, error. a wandering, a straying about; one led astray from the right way, roams hither and thither metaph. mental straying; error, wrong opinion relative to morals or religion; error which shows itself in action, a wrong mode of acting; error, that which leads into error, deceit or fraud

G4108 - planos - Of uncertain affinity; *roving* (as a *tramp*), that is, (by implication) an *impostor* or *misleader*: - deceiver, seducing. wandering, roving; misleading, leading into error; a vagabond, "tramp", imposter; corrupter, deceiver
