Dictionary Definition

To Restore – to bring back to a former or original condition.

Biblical Restoration

Something is always increased, multiplied or improved so that the later state is significantly better than the original state.

H7999 - shâlam

A primitive root; to *be safe* (in mind, body or estate); figuratively to *be* (causatively *make*) *completed*; by implication to *be friendly*; by extension to *reciprocate* (in various applications): - make amends, (make an) end, finish, full, give again, make good, (re-) pay (again), (make) (to) (be at) peace (-able), that is perfect, perform, (make) prosper (-ous), recompense, render, requite, make restitution, restore, reward, X surely.

Exodus 22:1

If a man shall steal an ox, or a sheep, and kill it, or sell it; he shall restore five oxen for an ox, and four sheep for a sheep.

If the theft be certainly found in his hand alive, whether it be ox, or ass, or sheep; he shall restore double.

Greek words

G600 - apokathistēmi

From G575 and G2525; to *reconstitute* (in health, home or organization): - restore (again).

G575 – apo - A primary particle; “*off*”, that is, *away* (from something near), in various senses (of place, time, or relation; literally or figuratively): - (X here-) after, ago, at, because of, before, by (the space of), for (-th), from, in, (out) of, off, (up-) on (-ce), since, with. In composition (as a prefix) it usually denotes *separation, departure, cessation, completion, reversal*, etc.

G2525 - kathistēmi - From G2596 and G2476; to *place down* (permanently), that is, (figuratively) to *designate, constitute, convoy*: - appoint, be, conduct, make, ordain, set.

G591 - apodidōmi

From G575 and G1325; to *give away*, that is, *up, over, back*, etc. (in various applications): - deliver (again), give (again), (re-) pay (-ment be made), perform, recompense, render, requite, restore, reward, sell, yield,

G1325 - didōmi - A prolonged form of a primary verb (which is used as an alternate in most of the tenses); to *give* (used in a very wide application, properly or by implication, literally or figuratively; greatly modified by the connection): - adventure, bestow, bring forth, commit, deliver (up), give, grant, hinder, make, minister, number, offer, have power, put, receive, set, shew, smite (+ with the hand), strike (+ with the palm of the hand), suffer, take, utter, yield.

G2675 - katartizo

From G2596 and a derivative of G739; to *complete thoroughly*, that is, *repair* (literally or figuratively) or *adjust*: - fit, frame, mend, (make) perfect (-ly join together), prepare, restore.

G2596 – kata - A primary particle; (preposition) *down* (in place or time), in varied relations (according to the case [genitive, dative or accusative] with which it is joined): - about, according as (to), after, against, (when they were) X alone, among, and, X apart, (even, like) as (concerning, pertaining to, touching), X aside, at, before, beyond, by, to the charge of, [charita-] bly, concerning, + covered, [dai-] ly, down, every, (+ far more) exceeding, X more excellent, for, from . . . to, godly, in (-asmuch, divers, every, -to, respect of), . . . by, after the manner of, + by any means, beyond (out of) measure, X mightily, more, X natural, of (up-) on (X part), out (of every), over against, (+ your) X own, + particularly, so, through (-oughout, -oughout every), thus, (un-) to (-gether, -ward), X uttermost, where (-by), with. In composition it retains many of these applications, and frequently denotes *opposition, distribution or intensity*.

G739 – artios - From G737; *fresh*, that is, (by implication) *complete*: - perfect.

G737 – arti - Adverb from a derivative of G142 (compare G740) through the idea of *suspension*; just *now*: - this day (hour), hence [-forth], here [-after], hither [-to], (even) now, (this) present.

to save, keep safe and sound, to rescue from danger or destruction one (from injury or peril) to save a suffering one (from perishing), i.e. one suffering from disease, to make well, heal, **restore to health** to preserve one who is in danger of destruction, to save or rescue to save in the technical biblical sense negatively 1b to deliver from the penalties of the Messianic judgment 1b to save from the evils which obstruct the reception of the Messianic deliverance < be make miscellaneous3 whole2, heal3, whole9, save93, 110>
